Trade deal sealed between UK and EU: no tariffs on Italian rice (Source: Ente Nazionale Risi Note)

On 24 December 2020, the European Union and the United Kingdom concluded a free trade agreement.

The agreement provides for the absence of tariffs and quotas on all goods, provided they comply with the appropriate rules of origin.

This means that Italian products can be exported to the UK duty free.

Similarly, British products can be imported into Italy at zero duty.

In both cases, the rules of origin will have to be respected. In this regard, there is a specific provision for rice, which allows Italian rice to be exported to the UK without payment of duty and which avoids the possibility that rice imported from non-EU countries by UK operators can be re-exported to the EU at zero duty, even if the rice itself has undergone substantial processing.

In the end, the requests that the Italian rice production chain had made in recent months to the task force set up at Palazzo Chigi were accepted.

As of 1 January, the European Union and the United Kingdom constitute two separate markets, so new requirements are envisaged in both directions.

Italian operators intending to export rice to the UK must therefore present the export declaration of the Ente Nazionale Risi and the export licence of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation (MAECI) to customs.


Africa has become a single market (Source: www.freshplaza.it)

On 1 January 2021, 54 out of 55 African countries have formed a large single market. This agreement provides for free trade with no or almost no tariffs and greater freedom of trade. This is a big step forward for 1.3 billion people. This decision can also be advantageous for those Italian companies that know how to fit into this context. Only Eritrea, because of the war with Ethiopia, has not signed the agreement, but it is expected to join soon.

Africa's inhabitants are 1.3 billion, but it is estimated that this will rise to 2.5 billion within 30 years.







In focus

The volumes cleared through EU customs in the first four months of the 2020/2021 campaign amount to 419,211 tonnes, in milled equivalent, 3% less than last year. Paddy rice imports, amounting to 7,813 tonnes, increased by 22%, husked rice imports, amounting to 174,081 tonnes, decreased by 8%, whereas semi-milled and milled rice imports, amount to 237,318 tonnes, are at the level recorded a year ago. Husked Basmati rice imports increased by 41,495 tonnes (+44%), from 94,164 tonnes a year ago to 135,659 tonnes today. EU exports, amounting to 78,813 tonnes, in milled equivalent, increased by 11% compared to last campaign, thanks to a 30% increase (+13,330 tonnes) of the semi-milled and milled rice Japonica exports which amounts to 57,777 tonnes.




In the last week paddy rice transfers by farmers reached 13,954 tonnes: 5,586 tonnes of long A grain, 4,273 tonnes of long B grain, 3,354 tonnes of round grain and 741 tonnes of medium grain. The total transfers increased by 30,465 tonnes (+5%) compared to last campaign.

At Commodity Exchange in Vercelli, the paddy prices did not change and quotations were rated as nominal.

Up to 31 December 2020, Italian imports, amounting to 33,933 tonnes, in milled equivalent, increased by 8,212 tonnes (+32%) compared to last campaign. More than 50% of the increase due to the greater imports (+4,512 tonnes, +38%) from Pakistan. Also the volumes cleared through customs increased (+5,586 tonnes, +19%), as you can see in table at the bottom.

Italian exports amount to 41,076 tonnes, in milled equivalent, 6,108 tonnes (+17%) more than last year. With 13,961 tonnes, Turkey is the largest importer of Italian rice.
